The development and testing of the Patient Centered Assessment Method to enhance care for complex patients in Scotland and Minnesota (USA)

The Patient Centered Assessment Method (PCAM) is a new tool to help providers assess a broad range of physical, mental wellbeing and social needs. It is also 'action oriented' so that, if needs are identified the practice will support the patient to access health system with community supports; support self-management approaches; encourage more productive (nurse) interactions with patients which should lead to more activated patients; facilitate decision support (by providers) to improve the care of patients; and encourage a proactive practice team. We will discuss the implementation of the PCAM tool in two different contexts, being Scotland and Minnesota (USA). In addition, we will share findings from our recent Scottish feasibility trial, along with findings about the experiences of providers in implementing this novel tool. The feasibility study was conducted to establish if it is feasible and acceptable to use integrate PCAM into primary care nurse led reviews for those with long-term conditions (LTCs) in Scotland, and how assess it might be best evaluated in a full trial (potential outcome measures).
